Greetings in the name of Christ! Even on the day of his birth, the world didn't seem to have room for Jesus. *"She gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn."* (Luke 2:7)

This is the time of year when we gather with family and friends to share stories and laughter and to rejoice in the season. However, this Christmas, many children of incarcerated parents will not be rejoicing. They will instead be worried that they may not see their parents again, they will be embarrassed that their friends might find out about their life situation, and they will be serving as caretakers for younger siblings even though they may be only eight years old. They are the ignored victims of crime - children of incarcerated parents. Like our Lord at his birth, they have been forgotten. However, there is good news- you don't just have to be sad about it; you can do something about it!

I invite you to prayerfully consider making an end-of-the-year contribution to CJAMM to support our New Day Camps, our Exodus Houses, and our Redemption Churches. CJAMM, along with all of the Annual Conference's Extension Ministries, has had a reduction of apportionments that we receive. That means, it is only by your generosity that we are able to accomplish the wonderful ministry that we do.

As you read the stories in this newsletter, I invite you to reflect upon how God is calling you to be in ministry with those who are in prison and their families. Hebrews 13:3 tells us to "Remember those in prison as if you were in prison with them." Perhaps God is calling you to serve as an adult leader at New Day Camp. Maybe you are called to visit our friends at the Exodus House. Perhaps you are being called to drive a van of prison inmates to a Redemption Church so they can worship in a holy place. There are so many different ways to "remember those who are in prison as if you were in prison with them." This holiday season, listen to God's voice and be in ministry with those whom our Lord called "the least of these." May the spirit of God and the season be with you and your family.

## LAWTON REDEMPTION CHURCH

The Lawton Aldersgate Redemption Church has gone through a series of highs and lows. The lows have included the deaths of two of our volunteers, Mr. William Richardson and most recently, his daughter, Nancy Callanan. We pray for the family members and for all of those who have been impacted by this loss.

The other lows have been due to the difficulties in keeping some of our older vans running. We finally had to give up all hope for the old “blue” van that has been used by several others before it got here. Between needing an entire transmission and other work, the cost to attempt to repair it would far exceed either what we could reasonably afford or what it was worth. But, that leads us to some of our high points.

First, and foremost, we found out just exactly how much support we have within the Wichitas District for this ministry. Cameron Campus Ministry and Lawton St. Paul's both immediately came to our rescue and allowed us the use of their vans. This allowed us some serious breathing room.

Then came the call from Lawton Heights UMC, which was the church that sent me out into ministry, my “home church.” They had a van, 1999 Dodge, with only 58,000 miles on it that they voted to donate to us, with the caveat that we allow them to use it the 3 or 4 times a year that they would need it. We had no problem in agreeing to that request. So, we now have a well-maintained, one-owner Dodge van that runs great!

Recently, I also received a phone call from our District Superintendent, Chris Tiger that another church was going to vote on donating their current van to us as well. In speaking to Chris about this, I learned that the trustees had already voted in favor of this decision, they are awaiting the vote of the Administrative Board. So, we may have a second new (to us) van before the end of the year! Hallelujah!

Finally, a huge praise report from the guys here. This summer we had the privilege of having one of the missionaries supported by the General Board, come and speak to the guys here. Her name is Mary Escobar, and her impact on the lives of children and their families in Paraguay is tremendous. The guys were so amazed by her that they wanted to know if there was some way they could help support her ministry. We have enough who want to participate that we will be signing a covenant with Mary Escobar to support her through our own efforts here. Granted, it won't be a large sum of money, but Mary was more touched by the fact that these men wanted to be a part of her ministry.

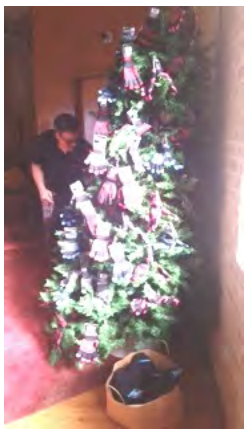
### Roundtable Class brings Annual HUGS Gifts
